The Image on the Cover is a detail of the January calendar from The Belles Heures of Jean de France, Duc de Berry, 1405–1408/1409. Pol, Jean, and Herman de Limbourg (Franco-Netherlandish, active in France, by 1399–1416). Here, the month of January is represented by two richly dressed men, one young and one old, seated back to back. The image evokes the double-headed divinity Janus, the god of beginnings and endings who gave his name to the first month of the year in the Roman calendar. The young man on the left drinks from a full bowl, while the old man on the right reaches for a jug to fill his empty one.

Medieval Stuffed Pike by Lord Ian Kennoven

2 clove garlic, minced

8 oz white bread, day old, crust removed 1 Cup whole milk 1 medium onion, minced 3 eggs, beat together

1 large pike- scaled & washed

1/2 Cup parsley, chopped
 1/4 Cup dill, chopped
 1 Tbsp butter
 1/2 Cup cucumber, minced
 1/2 tsp black pepper

1/4 tsp salt2 Large Carrots, coined1 Tbsp ginger powder2 stalks Celery, 1/4 inch slice1/2 Tbsp mace powder2 Bay leaves2 Tbsp Honey2 Cup peas, frozen1 qt fish stock1 Lemon for garnish1 bottle wheat beerOlives for garnish1/2 Cup Pickle juiceButter for garnish

From the dorsal side, incise the spine near the head and tail, cut ribs and remove spine. Eviscerate fish. Remove most of the flesh leaving only a 1/4 inch. Mince the flesh after removing all of the bones. Soak bread in milk then squeeze out as much milk as you can. Discard milk. Mince flesh, bread, onion, garlic parsley, dill, butter and cucumber together. Blend eggs, salt & pepper into mixture. Stuff mixture into fish and wrap with cheese cloth. Bend fish into "S" shape and place in baking pan. Mix together honey, ginger, mace and stock. Pour around fish. Add beer, pickle juice, carrots and celery. Cover and bake until thermometer inserted in thickest part of fish reads 145 F. (about 50 min in a convection oven set at 350) Five minutes before fish is done add peas and bay leaves (if using fresh peas, adjust cooking time.) Allow to cool to room temperature. Unwrap fish and place on bed of greens. Garnish with lemons, olives, dill, carrots and peas (discard celery.) Pipe butter around head and tail and place cut olives over eyes.

This is an amalgamation of a vague 1553 Polish recipe as described in Maria Dembinska's "Food & Drink in Medieval Poland" and festive stuffed pike-perch recipe in Lydia Liakhovskaya's "Russian Cuisine." I opted to use whole peas in the Russian recipe rather than the pea flour that would have been used in the Polish style.
