# Pennsic Pre-registration by Duchess Dorinda

After consulting with Lord Jacob, I have volunteered to at least get us through land grab at Pennsic. To start the process, I have registered the Shire of Heronter with the land office and asked for our traditional spot, so you may now register any time you would like! A few thoughts:

- Please don't forget to pre-register! Every person who registers gives the shire camp another two feet in width. This is a big deal! Our tradition has been that everyone who is camping with us \*must\* pre-register even if they are staying in a tent with someone else. That is how we have enough space for the Shire pavilion, the shower, and the gate. And it allows us to make exceptions for people who are new or thought they couldn't come. Please register!
- Children yes, please register your children even if they are staying in your tent. Obviously, I am not asking people to register children who aren't planning to attend, but if you think they will, it is very little money, and they get the same land allowance as an adult. Often people plan to bring the kids but don't pre-register them. Please do! We need the space.
- After you register, please send me an email with who is coming and what size tent you will have. To make the map for the encampment, I need to know how big your tent is and what side the door is on (if it matters). If you want to bring a sunshade, please let me know that too. Please also know that each person is allocated 250' sq ft, but this does not mean your tent may be 10x25! The square footage includes the tent, the fire buffer around it, and your contribution to the common space. Sometimes we can let people go over a bit if other people go under, but if your tent is large, or you want a private sunshade, you may need to register more people. If you have questions, let me know I love math.
- Our shire has always welcomed people from outside the group, but we ask that they be sponsored by someone in the group and we put out a courtesy note to the shire first. Please don't just invite people we don't know to camp with us.

- Set up weekend is an adventure, but please consider coming down for it. First, it gives you a chance to set up your tent without it being at the bottom of a packed car! Then you can drive right in the second weekend! Or are you staying? Great! I can't stay the full two weeks, so please let me know if you can. We need to have someone in the camp. But that first weekend we need as many people as we can to help get the tents up and do gate, walls and SHOWER!
- Speaking of the shower last year we tried a new location. It worked well as far as convenience for us and the folks from Drachenwald, but the drainage seemed a bit lacking. Do we want to have it in the same spot or moved back to the old location?
- We will again be asking for a camp fee from those in camp and a smaller fee for those who just wish to use the shower. But please note this is not an open shower and I would ask that we not "sell" shower spots to people outside the Heronter and Drachenwald camps. I think we have one couple who may be grandfathered in, but let us not expand beyond that! Let me check on propane costs, but I expect costs to be similar to last year.

I am sure there will be more later, but I wanted people to know that we are registered, and they can register any time.

Please let me know if there are questions - it has been a while since I have done this! -- Dorinda

As always, this is a FREE event to all SCAdians who attend in garb and troll in. The day will be full of entertainment, pageantry, arts, games, food and tournaments in Heavy Weapons, Archery, Thrown Weapons and Fencing. This year we will feature the AEthlemearc Kingdom Equestrian Championship.

It is a day of grand tournaments. Fighters, fencers, archers and throwers, come prepared to show your skill and be cheered on by the crowd!

It is a day for the New King and Queen, Maynard and Liadain to choose their Equestrian Champion! So, come and compete for the honor of being their Champion or cheer on your favorite charger!

The Championship courses will be designed and run by last year's King's Champion. Be prepared for a few surprises. The arena is a temporary arena with a very solid footing. The ground here is hard with a capital H. Riding helms are recommended for adults and required for minors. In addition to Champs we will be doing mounted archery. Because of the hardness of the ground, no contact games will be permitted. There will be no equestrian authorizations at Champs, please plan accordingly.

Everyone bringing horse must provide the Equestrian Marshal with the following:

In State - Current Coggins with in two years.

Out-of State - Current Coggins with the current calendar year. Transport papers from your state of origin.

The Equestrian coordinator will also need to know the number of horses you are bringing and the size of the trailer you are hauling in. It is a day of grand Art. Lady Isolda will be hosting the Artisan's Tents and invites one and all to come and share their skills. Work on projects, demonstrate your skills, display your art and visit with fellow artisans.

It is a day of grand entertainment. Musicians, Gamers, Dancers, Singers, Thespians, Jesters, Drummers, Jugglers and more are invited to come and share their talents. We encourage all who enjoy performing to come and celebrate the day.

It is a day of knowledge. Please come and display your collections, books, games or those items of which you are most proud. You will have the chance to talk about what you love most about the middle ages and share your knowledge with others.

It is a day to show who we are. We ask that you bring your good spirit, pageantry and good will. There is room for banners so please show your personal and group devices proudly. # Happy New Year??? In May??? By Dagonell the Juggler

"The SCA started in 1966, when a few friends who were history buffs and science fiction/fantasy fans hosted a big outdoor party in Berkeley, California.

The invitation stated that a Tournament would be held on the first of May, summoning 'all knights to defend in single combat the title of 'fairest' for their ladies.'

Everyone enjoyed the first tournament so much that they agreed a second should be run, but in a larger setting. In order to reserve one of the public parks for the gathering, the organizers needed to list a name for their group on the application. Since recreating the Middle Ages in 20th-century Berkeley was an anachronism (something 'out of time'), and because the goal was creativity, they came up with 'The Society for Creative Anachronism'. It was a spur-of-the-moment invention; they had no idea that the name would stay with their group into the future." [1]

The SCA starts its numbering system for the calendar from "The First Tournament", that first middle-ages themed backyard party. It was held on May 1, 1966, so our calendar year starts on May 1<sup>st</sup>. A.S. stands for "Anno Societatus", or "In the Year of the Society". There was no "Year Zero", we started immediately with A.S. I, so the SCA won't actually be 50 years old until A.S. 51. (2016 C.E.)

Interestingly, the Super Bowl number always matches the SCA year. In 1996, the Super Bowl numbers were changed from Roman to Arabic because computer censorship programs thought that "XXX" indicated an adult website. The SCA kept the Roman numeral system, despite the additional difficulties, because it looked less modern.
