

Excerpts from the court report at Harvest Raid:

The Report of the Court of Their Royal Majesties Duncan and Ilish, King and Queen of Aethelmearc, held at Harvest Raids in the Shire of Heronter on the 25th day of September Anno Societatis XLV, THLord Brandubh Donnghaile, Silver Buccle, with the assistance of Master Fridrikr Tomasson.

Duchess Dorinda Courtenay was invited forth to speak as the Youth Marshal of the day. She invited all of the youth who fought in the tourney to come forward and presented them all with tokens, and announced that Aaron the Swift had been the victor that day and she presented him with his prize. She further announced that Thorgrim of Blackwater had been deemed to be the most chivalrous fighter on the field.

Lord William Peregrinus had conducted two fencing tourneys during the day and wished to present prizes to Don Christian Amaury de Launey who had won the Single Elimination Tournament and presented a prize to master Quinn Kerr who had won the Round Robin Tournament.

Their Majesties called upon Gruffydd ap Anarawd to attend Them. They praised his efforts in fighting and recruiting new members at demos, arriving early and staying late for events to work, and being of great use in setting up the Heronter camp at Pennsic, and so They Awarded him Arms. I write this missive on the eve of an important anniversary for me: on October 29, 2000, I lost my partner, Kris, to an automobile accident. While I was looking for a proper way to honor his memory this year, I received the shocking news that Kris's gravestone was destroyed in an act of vandalism. This left me disheartened, but more aware of the possibilities of new beginnings than ever before.

I have overcome many barriers since Kris's passing, but perhaps the hardest has been my physical disability. Spending nearly a decade watching the fighters of our glorious Kingdom, a seed was planted in my mind. I vowed to take up the gauntlet of fighting, with the intention of fighting a challenge at Harvest Raid in order to both raise money for a new stone, and to break through the mental pitfalls of having a painful illness. At War Practice, I was given the full amount for a new stone, and told to focus on fighting, leaving me ever amazed with the generosity of our SCAdian family. There were many people who helped me along the journey, culminating in a three hour challenge at Harvest Raid. Not only did I manage to physically fulfill my challenge, I was also able to honor Kris's memory as he would have wished. Before every bout, I asked my opponents to vow that they'd make certain to tell their loved ones how much they are loved. I have since been told many stories from fighters who took their vows to heart, and still carry the spirit of my challenge into every fight. There is no better honor for Kris's memory than this...

Blackwater at our annual Hallowtide event, to be held on November 6th, 2010 (A.S. XLV). Bring your armor, as we are hosting a day filled with heavy fighting featuring a Gold Chain Tournament and a Newbie Tourney, for those with less than one year authorization in weapons, a First Blood Tourney, and a Rock-Em Sock-Em Robots fight. (We will be offering Authorization on the day of the tournament.) Fencing will be available once again, thanks to Her Grace Dorinda Courtenay, who has once again consented to be marshal.

We are most honored to announce that this year, Their Royal Majesties, Duncan von Halstern and Ilish O'Donovan, King and Queen of Æthelmearc will be in attendance and will be holding Curia during the day and Court prior to Feast.

We also will be hosting a Consort's Gallery along with surprises, classes, artisan's row, an open A&S competition, sideboard and a wondrous feast to round out the evening. There are areas planned for games and crafts, with spaces for scribes and children alike, to commune. This promises to be a rousing, relaxing event, filled with fellowship and friendship. (And did we mention surprises?) There will also be a Silent Auction held.

The event opens at 9:00 a.m. and closes at 9:00 p.m. The site is the same as last year: Trinity United Methodist Church, 131 North Ninth (9th) Street, Olean, N.Y. 14760. Event fee is \$8 per adult (18 and older). Children and teens aged 6 to 17 years will be charged \$4 and those 5 and under will be considered guests of the Shire. The \$5 non-member surcharge will be collected so please remember to bring acceptable proof of membership. Sideboard will

Directions:

From the East: Take your best route to I-86 west bound. Take Exit #25 (Buffalo Street) and turn left at the bottom of the ramp. Take Buffalo Street to the second light and turn right onto North 12th Street. Stay on North 12th thru three blocks and to the second stop sign at Washington Street. Turn left and go to North 9th Street and turn right. Trinity Methodist is on the right hand side of the street and parking is in a small lot beside the church and on the street.

From the West: Take your best route to I-86 west bound. Take Exit #25 (Buffalo Street) and turn right at the bottom of the ramp and follow above directions.

From the North: Coming south on Rt. 16-Get on I-86 westbound in Maplehurst at exit 27 and follow directions from east getting off I-86 at exit #25. Coming down Rt. 219 – get on I-86 east bound in Salamanca or at Seneca Junction and follow directions from the west getting off I-86 at exit #25. Coming down I-390 follow directions from the east once you are on I-86.

From the South: Make your best way to Olean thru PA. If coming up Rt. 219 get on I-86 eastbound at Seneca Junction and follow directions from the West. Any other route should have you finding Rt. 16 (North or South) or Rt. 417 (East or West) which intersects in the center of Olean. Yahoo Maps easily finds this address.
